

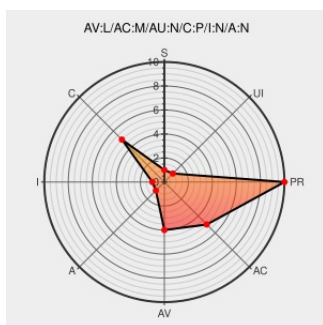

Certain versions of [Eject](#) from [Eject](#) contain the following vulnerability: eject 2.0.10, when installed setuid on systems such as SuSE Linux 7.3, generates different error messages depending on whether a specified file exists or not, which allows local users to obtain sensitive information.
