

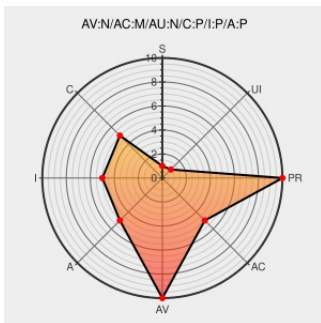

Certain versions of [Pixlie](#) from [Pixlie](#) contain the following vulnerability: pixlie.php in Pixlie 1.7 allows remote attackers to trigger the reading and JPEG image processing of files in a remote directory tree via a URL in the root parameter. NOTE: this can be leveraged for traffic amplification or other denial of service.
