

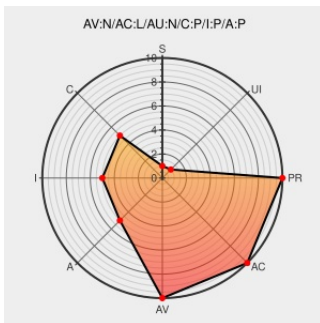

Certain versions of [Vbulletin](#) from [Vbulletin](#) contain the following vulnerability:

The install/upgrade.php scripts in vBulletin 4.1 and 5 allow remote attackers to create administrative accounts via the customerid, htмлdata[password], htмлdata[confirmpassword], and htмлdata[email] parameters, as exploited in the wild in October 2013.

CVE-2013-6129 has been assigned by [M](#) cve@mitre.org to track the vulnerability
