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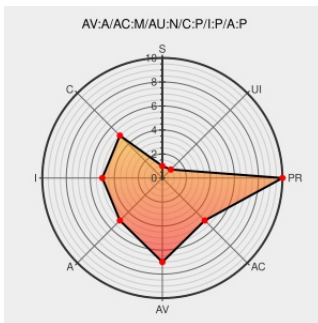

The Football Espana magazine (aka com.triactivemedia.footballspana) application @7F0801AA for Android does not verify X.509 certificates from SSL servers, which allows man-in-the-middle attackers to spoof servers and obtain sensitive information via a crafted certificate.

CVE-2014-7127 has been assigned by cert@cert.org to track the vulnerability
