

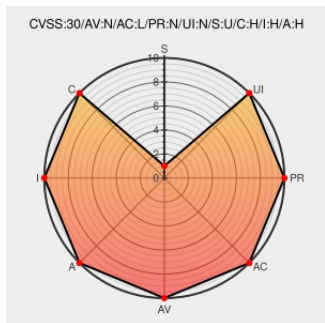

Certain versions of [Cardio Server](#) from [Epiphanyhealthdata](#) contain the following vulnerability:

SQL injection vulnerability in the login page in Epiphany Cardio Server 3.3 allows remote attackers to execute arbitrary SQL commands via a crafted URL.

CVE-2015-6537 has been assigned by [M](#) [cve@mitre.org](#) to track the vulnerability - currently rated as **CRITICAL** severity.

CVSS3 Score: **9.8 - CRITICAL**
