Certain versions of [Proxygen](#) from [Proxygen Project](#) contain the following vulnerability:

The SPDY/2 codec in Facebook Proxygen before 2015-11-09 truncates a certain field to two bytes, which allows hijacking and injection attacks.

CVE-2015-7264 has been assigned by cert@cert.org to track the vulnerability - currently rated as **CRITICAL** severity.
