Certain versions of [Phpmyfaq](#) from [Phpmyfaq](#) contain the following vulnerability:

In phpMyFAQ before 2.9.9, there is Cross-Site Request Forgery (CSRF) in admin/ajax.attachment.php and admin/att.main.php.

CVE-2017-15733 has been assigned by [M](#) cve@mitre.org to track the vulnerability - currently rated as **HIGH** severity.
