Certain versions of [Phpshe](#) from [Phpshe](#) contain the following vulnerability:

Multiple SQL Injection vulnerabilities in PHPSHE 1.7 in phpshe/admin.php via the (1) ad\_id, (2) menu\_id, and (3) cashout\_id parameters, which could let a remote malicious user execute arbitrary code.

CVE-2020-18215 has been assigned by [M](#) cve@mitre.org to track the vulnerability - currently rated as **HIGH** severity.
