

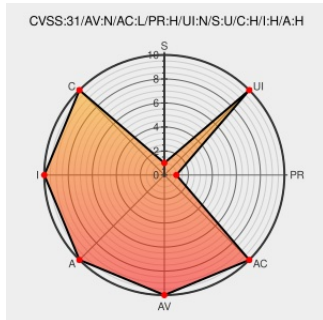

Certain versions of [Buddybadges](#) from [Buddybadges Project](#) contain the following vulnerability:

The buddybadges WordPress plugin through 1.0.0 does not sanitise and escape a parameter before using it in a SQL statement, leading to a SQL injection exploitable by high privilege users

CVE-2022-3925 has been assigned by [contact@wpscan.com](#) to track the vulnerability - currently rated as **HIGH** severity.
